







The past year may have been a challenge for many, but I am proud to say that Minnesota Life College weathered the storm and laid the foundation for our future. Our Annual Report gives me a chance to reflect on the past year and share with our friends the successes that have happened.

We were thrilled to work with the Board of Directors and align our vision, mission and values to better reflect who we are and what we do. It has created a clear path for our future and is a guiding tool as we plan our growth. The Board has determined that the program needs to grow and expand, and that provides an exciting opportunity to create our vision.

We are mission driven, and transforming lives for young adults with learning disabilities and autism spectrum disorders is something we take very seriously. It is our goal that every young adult will graduate with the skills necessary to live independently, be employed with meaningful work, and to be able to live and participate in the community. This year we had nine young adults enter the "Real World" after graduation, and all are living independently.

We have grown in our relationships within the business community as we spend time with our employers and volunteer worksites, sharing the need for training and understanding of simple accommodations that can help the rising number of young people with autism spectrum disorders and soon-to-be young adults entering the workforce. The latest statistic, that the 1 in 91 children, age five, that have been diagnosed with autism, suggests a much more proactive approach is needed to employ these individuals.

This past year we reached out and partnered with the University of St. Thomas to sponsor an Interagency Discussion: "Making Services Count for Young Adults ages 18-30 with Mild to Moderate Disabilities". Our keynote speaker was Brenda Smith Myles, nationally known for her work in Autism. She presented "The Hidden Curriculum" to over 70 participants representing agencies throughout the state. This was an opportunity to listen to the needs of agencies and identify the gaps in services that are not yet available for this population. A smaller subset of the group met this past spring to further define gaps and discuss what action we could take to move closer to addressing those gaps.

We partnered with seven other agencies to bring in three guest speakers for our John Lighty Lecture Series to help the community better understand the needs of young adults with learning disabilities and autism spectrum disorders.

Our National Advisory Board has grown to 13 professionals that are experts in their fields and come from all across the United States. They have been instrumental in helping us plan and develop our program, in addition to sharing current research with our staff.

This would not have happened without the support we receive from our students, parents, staff, friends, professionals, our business partners and other supporting organizations that have helped shape our path. It takes a lot of dedicated people to make changes in the world. It is with a grateful heart that we say thank you to our donors and friends that have made a difference in the lives of our students.

72 professionals came together to discuss making services count for young adults ages 18-30 with mild to moderate disabilities. They represented 15 agencies, 42 schools, 5 health-care agencies, and 10 parents and volunteers.

The goals of the Interagency Discussion that took place in November, 2008 were to get individual agencies together to identify three areas; services currently available, where the gaps in service provisions are and identify future needs/emerging trends in the area of service provision for adults ages 18-30 with mild-to-moderate disabilities.






